

#### From the Pastor

We live in a world where we can become overwhelmed by negativity and lose sight of the ways that God is blessing us. Learning to express our gratitude is important. Gratitude is a practice that enriches our lives and that can strengthen our connections with God and with other people. Let's join in an exciting journey that cultivates a spirit of gratitude in our lives this month. Here are three easy things you can do.

1. Daily Gratitude Rituals: It's easy for us to overlook small miracles and blessings that grace our path through life when we get caught up in the hustle and bustle of daily living. Taking just a few short moments each day to express our gratitude can significantly shift our perspective and fill our hearts with joy.



Carving out time to thank God for the abundance that fills our lives can become a powerful practice whether we do it through prayer and meditation, or by just reflecting on the day's blessings. 

## **Coming Soon!**


Have you noticed how quickly things are changing these days?

We never imagined that we'd be contacting our family doctors using MyChart just a few years ago, or that our telephones would send us a short message to let us know that it's time to pick up a refill of a prescription. Our televisions used to be so much easier to use; but now, we have to know the difference between HDMI1 and HDMI2, and we often need to figure out how to use multiple remotes. Many of us had never used Zoom just a few years ago, and many of us had never imagined being able to worship at home on YouTube or listen to last week's sermon on an app while we are driving. Websites – particularly the websites that churches use – have changed, too.

Our church's website was once simply used to share information about our church and its ministry; but now, it can be used as a power tool for outreach, and that's why we are going to be updating our website in the next few weeks. Churches have learned that it's important to reach people in different ways.

We released our new app several months ago, and we are using it, primarily, as a tool to share information with people who are already members of our church. If you haven't downloaded it yet, you can easily do it by scanning this QR Code on your cell phone. Our app gives us a way to share information with you, and it gives you easy access to our church's calendar, a Bible reading program, an easy way to let us know about ways that you want to use your skills and talents in ministry, an easy way to add someone to our prayer list or contact the church office, and even an easy way to register for VBS.






Our new website has a different purpose. You can still find lots of information about our ministry, but our new website is primarily designed to meet the needs of those who want a quick glimpse of what Christ's Lutheran Church is all about. People who use our new website will be more easily able to contact us, to schedule a baptism or meet with the pastor, to add a person to our prayer list or to join our worship livestream, to learn more about what times we gather for worship, and to even learn more about what our worship services are like and how people dress when they gather for worship at Christ's Lutheran Church. Our new

website is about building relationships, connecting with people who want to know more about our ministry, and enabling people to take the next step forward if they want to learn more about our ministry or if they're interested in joining hands with us in ministry.


#### Our new website will also offer you an easy way to join our worship livestream. If you join us in worship

using the YouTube link on your television, nothing will change. However, if you join our livestream using the church website, you will need to get to the link to YouTube in a slightly different way. But the good news is – it's easy! You will find a button at the top of our website entitled: Worship Livestream (how easy is that?). Simply click the Worship Livestream button at the top of our website and you're on your way! There's just one last step....



Once you have clicked the "Worship Livestream"

button, there's just one last easy step! You will be taken to our "Worship Livestream" page and will see our new "Join Our Livestream" link. Just click the link and you will be taken to the same YouTube page that we have been using since we began to livestream our services. We hope to livestream our worship services right onto our new website soon, but we have run into a few of the bumps that we've all needed to overcome since the pandemic hit.



We hope that our new website will be a new and exciting step forward in our ministry, and we hope that it will be a great tool for our outreach, too. Please don't forget to download our new app if you haven't done it already. We're adjusting. We're learning. We're moving forward into the future that Jesus has planned for Christ's Lutheran Church in a new and exciting time when we are able to share information and help people to connect with our church and ministry in some new ways.

# CLC ANNUAL FLEA MARKET AND BAKE SALE

#### Saturday June 1 ~ 8 am to 2 pm

This year's flea market is rapidly approaching, so we hope you will keep this in mind as you do your spring cleaning! You may drop off your items beginning Thursday, May 23rd and Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup> during church office hours, 10 am to 2 pm, and Saturday May 25<sup>th</sup> and Sunday May 26<sup>th</sup> when you come to worship services. Tuesday, May 28<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup>, you may drop off items from 9:15 am to 2 pm and from 6 to 8 pm. We will not be accepting items on Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, which will be strictly a workday for our volunteers! Please remember that the volunteers have to unload, sort and price your items, so please make sure your donated items are clean and usable.

Baked goods can be dropped off on Friday, May  $31^{st}$ , during church office hours. Pre-bagged cookies in either  $\frac{1}{2}$  or dozen amounts, brownies, mini loaves of breads or cakes are great sellers.

Please remember that we cannot accept the following due to the difficulty or cost of disposing of them if they do not sell: Hazardous materials including automotive oil and lubricants, paints and aerosols, household cleaners, TV's, computers and related items (hardware, software and peripherals), clothing, boots and shoes, large furniture and large exercise equipment such as weigh benches, treadmills, and ellipticals.

Flea market sign-up sheets will be available in the entryway. If you can spare any time to help with setup, pricing, working the day of the sale, clean up and/or donating baked goods, any amount of time is greatly appreciated. Even if it is just an hour or two! Any youth help would be great as well.


